Stacy and Tom are writers/contributing editors for Fiddlehead Magazine. Both have been reporters and columnists for many regional publications including The Boston Globe and The Telegraph of Nashua.

Nature Photography, on May 11, will leave you with skills to capture the beauty of nature through your camera lens.

Award-winning photographer Geoff Forester reviews techniques to make meaningful and inspiring photos of nature, with an emphasis on how they can be used by the casual photographer. Participants will travel to the nearby Audubon Center and Massabesic Lake to take photos, then return to the school to display and edit images. Sophisticated camera equipment is not needed, but a SLR camera is preferred.
