## **Loeb School Hosting Police-Media Relations Workshop**

MANCHESTER -- The Nackey S. Loeb School of Communications is presenting its popular Police-Media Workshop on April 15, 2011. The all-day workshop is designed for police officers who interact with the media.

With presenters including the Attorney General's Office, the media, a noted media attorney and a respected police Public Information Officer, the session covers everything from the state Right-to-Know Law to preparing news releases.

The workshop is being held at the school, 749 E. Industrial Park Drive, Manchester, from 9 am to 3 pm. The registration fee of \$50 includes lunch.

Senior Assistant Attorney General Will Delker and media attorney Gregory Sullivan will address the First Amendment and Right to Know Law, including what information can and should be released.

Deputy Chief Shawn Patten of the Salem Police Department will discuss compiling media information, writing news releases and preparing for news conferences or media interviews.

A panel of New Hampshire journalists, including WMUR's Andy Hershberger, Kathryn Marchocki of the New Hampshire Union Leader and Associated Press Photographer Jim Cole, will join officers in a discussion about media coverage and building and maintaining relations between police and the media. Officers and the media panel also will role-play police-media scenarios.
